In previous years, this off-season event was the Ohio State Championship, but with the expectation that they will eventually be moving to a District model that will also include teams from Western/Central Pennsylvania and West Virginia, they have opened up the scope of the event to include teams from those areas. Quasics ranked 20th out of the 88 teams in contention, and were honored to accept the invitation to compete in this one-day event on May 27th in Westerville, Ohio at the Rike Center (Otterbein University).

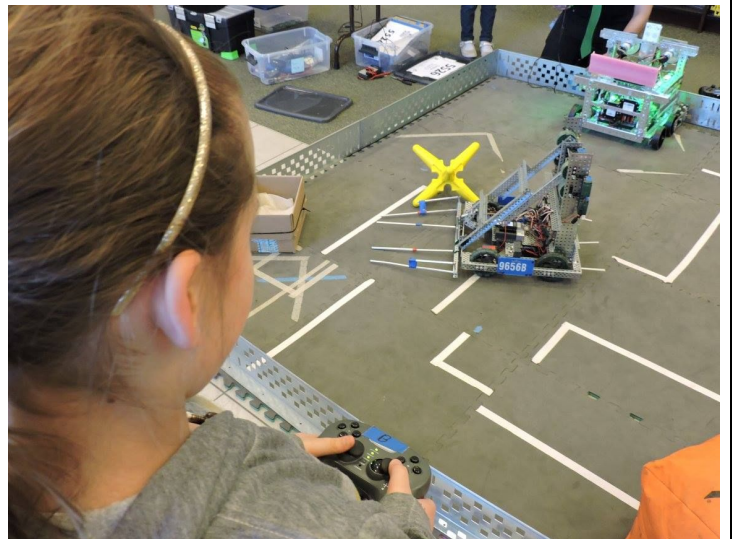

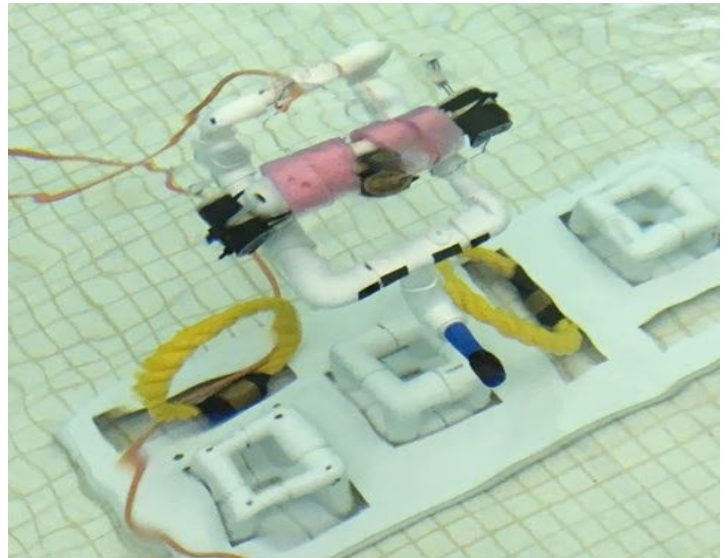
